

Welcome to Nursery Summer Term 1 Newsletter 2024

We are looking forward to working together to support your child's learning journey.

This half term our topic is 'Traditional Tales'.

Here is some information about the skills and knowledge your child will be learning linked to these topics.

The children have loved our Little Wandle Phonics Scheme called Foundations for Phonics. We have taught the children 17 new sounds/phonemes s,a,t,p,i,n,m,d,g,o,c/k,e,u,r,h,b,f it would be great if you could recap these with your child at home. During our Numbers and Patterns sessions we have taught the children to recite numbers past 5, to recognise numerals, talk about and explore 2D and 3D shapes, to use mathematical language, to extend and create patterns.


Our Curriculum – Here you will be able to find out the details about what your child will be learning week by week. We have included the books and songs we will focus on. If you have any questions, please ask.



Three Billy Goats Gruff

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Book Review this half term - Miss Williams recommends - Once Upon a Time by John Prater

A small boy describes his dull day, while all around him all manner of dramas are taking place with Goldilocks, The Three Little Pigs, a Wolf, Humpty Dumpty and a host of other favourite nursery characters! I love this story. The boy goes through his day while different characters act out their stories around him. The illustrations are wonderful and they invite conversations about what is going on in the pictures.



Warmer Weather

The weather is getting warmer so we will be spending a lot of time outside. Please ensure you apply suncream on your child before they come to school and that they have a summer hat/cap. As we will be using the water tray daily your child may get wet, please have a spare set of labelled clothes (it doesn't need to be school uniform) in a bag on their peg.

Purple Mash

I hope you have managed to access Purple Mash at home. I have pinned topics to the board – Fairy Tales, Summer and Feelings to link with what we are learning this half term. We also use the phonic games which are great. Once logged into Purple Mash click on Early Years then Mini Mash, there are lots of activities to explore.
