Home Learning



In Year 1, Autumn 2, home learning consists of reading and Purple Mash homework. You will find your children's log in details in front of your child's red reading record. Please practice logging in to Purple Mash with your children to support them with their computing lessons. In addition to this, we will also set a Maths task every Monday to be completed by the following Monday. This Maths task will consolidate the learning done in school in the previous week.

We encourage you to hear your child read their phonics book daily, for between 10 and 15 minutes. By the end of the week your child should be a master of their book; they should be able to read with fluency and pace, which will help to develop automaticity. When you read with your child, please write what they have read and the date in their red reading record. Please send in your child's red book and phonics book every day so we can read with your child and change their books when needed.



To further support your child's reading we encourage children to share stories and talk about what they have read or what has been read to them. For ideas of how to support your child's comprehension and inference skills, please see the VIPERS on the school website.

Uniform



Now it's getting colder, please could you ensure that your child brings to school a warm winter coat. We will be going outside for our learning so please ensure coats are in school each day. You are welcome to pack hats, scarves and gloves that are named. There has been a significant rise in the number of items being sent to lost property as lots of these clothes are unnamed. We teach the children to put gloves into pockets and hats down one sleeve of the coat for safekeeping.



Into our Imagination



In English, the children are learning all about traditional tales and well-known stories. The children are learning about the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears and have made porridge to help with their instruction writing. The children will read and learn many stories to support writing for different purposes and to develop their understanding of the structure of traditional tales.



In Maths, Year 1 children will continue to consolidate their understanding of place value within 10 and will delve deeper into addition and subtraction before exploring 2D and 3D shapes.



In Science, the children will be learning all about the seasons: Autumn, Winter, Spring, and Summer. We will observe seasonal changes and take part in an Autumn walk. The children will look closely at our environment spotting changes from Autumn to Winter and monitor the weather.

In Computing, the children will continue to develop their skills navigating Purple Mash, their understanding of grouping and sorting and how we can use technology to support with this. They will finish this topic by learning how to create an animated story book using Code.

In Geography, the children will be learning about human features. They will begin to understand that human features are designed and built by humans. We will do this by exploring houses, shops, offices, farms, factories and ports.



In Art, we will be studying and creating a showstopper piece inspired by Karen Lederer. The children will create a printed piece of art inspired by Karen Lederer's Untitled 30. They will learn how to use a stencil and create their very own stencils too.

In Music, the children will be developing their understanding of rhythm and pulse by learning and practicing the songs for our Christmas performance of Ralph the Reindeer.

In RE, the children will be learning all about Eid and Christmas which links to our PSHE topic in Jigsaw of celebrating differences. What an exciting term we have ahead of us!

Recommended Reads from Jeffers Class




'The Lion Inside' by Rachel Bright because:
