# Year One Newsletter Autumn 1 2024







We have enjoyed a fun packed start to the new school year and we are incredibly proud of how well the children are settling into their new classes and routines. The children thoroughly enjoyed our theme of 'Into the Jungle'. We listened to new stories, created animal art, discussed and wrote what we would take in our safari backpack, as well as singing lots of animal songs. Thank you so much for your support parents with the amazing costumes and helping your child settle so well, we really do appreciate it. You should be incredibly proud of your children; they have returned to school full of positivity and eagerness to learn, and we are all so excited for the year ahead. We can't wait to see what the rest of the school year has in store for us!

# Reading

In Year 1 we continue following 'Little Wandle, Letters and Sounds Revised' for phonics and reading. Your child will be sent home with a reading book which matches their phonics level based on the end of year assessments from Reception next week. The children will be reassessed once we have completed the first 5 weeks of Year 1 phonics teaching. Children who are reading Phase 4 set 2 books will be benchmarked in the coming weeks and will bring home a colour banded book, in addition to their Phonics book, to read at home too.

### Please ensure your child brings in their reading book every day.

Children use their Phonics book in their Guided Reading session and it can prove incredibly tricky if they do not have their book to hand as we do not have 'spare' copies. We encourage you to hear your child read their phonics book at least once a day, for 5-10 minutes, to develop their fluency. By the end of the week the children should be able to read most words by sight and with more fluency. Please make a note in their red reading record of when and what they have read and any comments you may have.



It is also helpful to talk about the book including the setting, characters, plot and making predictions. To support your child's reading comprehension we use VIPERS. You can find a copy of these on the school website under the Year 1 teaching and learning tab.

# Library



Children in each Year 1 class will be able to visit the library again this year. They will be able to choose 1 book to share with you at home.

Please ensure that your child remembers to bring to school their library book on the relevant day so they get to change their book and experience a range of brilliant stories we have to offer.

#### Marvellous Me



# Year 1 Curriculum for the Autumn 1 Term - 'Past and Present'



We are beginning our journey in Year 1 with our thematic learning of the past and present. In English, the children are spending 2 weeks exploring the texts of each of our amazing Year 1 authors; Oliver Jeffers, Tom Percival and David McKee. The children will learn lots of facts about the different authors and focus on different





sentences to retell parts of different narratives.

In Maths, Year 1 children will continue to consolidate their understanding of place value within 10 and begin to delve deeper into addition and subtraction.

In Science, the children will be learning all about themselves, focussing on naming parts of the human body and the 5 senses. This links well to our theme of 'Being Me' in our Jigsaw lessons (PSHE) where we will learn about how special it is to be ourselves.

In History, the children will then explore toys from the modern day and throughout history which is where our 'Toy Making Workshop' will send them into a world of toys from the past.



To link with our theme of 'Past and Present', in Design Technology we will learn all about windmills; their purpose and how they are used now. The children will design, create then evaluate a windmill using wheels and axels.

In Computing, we will be developing our skills on Purple Mash, deepen our understanding of online safety and we will be creating a class pictogram.

This half term we are looking at the theme of friendship in RE and linking these to different religious stories. What an exciting half term ahead of us!

Thank you for your patience and understanding when we dismiss the children at the end of the day. Our priority is the safety of the children, and we take great care in ensuring that children leave with their designated adult. We dismiss the children one at a time, and although this makes the process a little slower at the beginning of the year, it ensures that all children are handed over safely. The process will speed up once we know you all better and the children are in a routine. Please ensure you are at the correct gate at 3:10pm and you make your way to the front of the parent crowd as your child approaches the front of the line.

If another adult is picking up your child, please ensure that the office is informed, and the adult is written on their collection form. Thank you for your continued support in making the end of day dismissal a safe success.
