

Year 2 Curriculum learning



'Once upon a time...'

In Year 2 we link areas of our learning as much as possible to immerse ourselves in our topics.

We begin our English work this term with traditional tales. We will be retelling well-known traditional tales and will be discovering the ingredients that make this genre so well-loved. We will become authors and create our own original tales. In addition, we will be describing characters and settings developing our grammatical knowledge

and will be introduced to a wider range of punctuation.

We will be immersing ourselves into 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff', 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' and 'Little Red Riding Hood'.

- . In Computing this half term will be based on familiarising ourselves with the iPads and how to use them effectively. We will learn about e-safety and how to keep ourselves safe using the internet using Purple Mash.
- . Our Geography work will focus on the environment around us this half term and will build upon our knowledge of maps from Year 1. We will further develop our map skills, learning about aerial views and keys. We will look at local maps identifying changes to land use over time and will find out about where we are in the world in relation to other countries using Google Earth. We will find out about journeys and will create our own map of a journey.
- . This term in RE and this half term we will be learning about belonging, special places and Christianity.
- . In Maths we will be beginning our learning journey with number, counting and the place value of two- digit numbers. We will compare and order number. Following this, we will move on to addition and subtraction and begin counting in 2's, 5's and 10's in the first instance.
- . In PSHE we will be involved in activities and discussions that create our class codes of conduct. We will use our 'Jigsaw' lessons to develop our skills and we will discuss our values of the month and try to use them in our every-day life.
- . Music will be taught by Mrs Horwood each week and this half term will involve rhymes and percussion skills.
- . Our Science theme focusses on plants. We will be locating and classifying plants around us in our school grounds and will create several investigations that will help us identify the best place and best conditions for plants to grow well. We are going to be planting and creating our own Year 2 garden with bulbs! If you have any plant cuttings, bulbs or pots that you would be willing to donate we would be very grateful! Our garden will be outside of our back doors and will really enhance our Year 2 environment!

In Art, we will be developing our sketching skills and linking this to our Science topic of plants as well as looking carefully at ourselves to create portraits in both realistic and abstract forms.

We are certainly going to be very busy!



Helping your child at home.





We would love for you to read with your child for a short time every day. We would like you to add your comments in the small red book.

We change our books once a week and the designated day for your child. This will be in the front of the red book.


We believe that reading opens a world of learning and

Please make sure that your child brings a named water bottle to school each morning. They will be able to drink when needed and will take it to PE, playtime and lunchtime. As they are at the early stages of personal organisation — a named bottle is very helpful to staff!

We have **fruit** available for children every day. Some children like to bring in their own named fruit boxes and that is fine. Please remember – the snack should be a healthy snack and no nuts of any kind are allowed please.

being able to read well offers wonderful life opportunities.

We want our children to love books and to leave Year 2 having read many high-quality texts, having learned many new words and being able to read like a storyteller with their level appropriate books.



Your child will bring home a reading book, this will be a phonics book that is carefully matched to their phonic knowledge following a phonics check. This book will be

decodable, and this is a book your child can read to you.

Your child will also bring home a colour coded book for you to share and **read together**. This book will help your child acquire a breadth of language and will introduce many words that may not be decodable using phonics.

In addition, your child will visit the library every week and will be able to bring home a library book to share with you.

It is ideal that these books are read and discussed several times (especially the phonic book) and that your child has the opportunity to hear you reading some of the book – developing expression and intonation. We want your child to feel a master of the book they are reading and to be able to read with flow is vital to their understanding of a text.

Birthday Treats

Many children like to bring in treats for their class on their birthday (although there is no pressure to do so). We ask that all treats are **nut free** please as we have children with extreme allergies. We will not be able to give out any treats that contain nuts.

If your child has an allergy, we are happy for you to provide us with the treats that you as parent experts are happy for them to have over the year so that they are included safely. We will keep these in a named tub/provided by you in our classroom cupboards so that the right treat goes to the right child.







Each class is timetabled for indoor and outdoor PE every week

We would like your child to wear their Priory Rise PE kit on PE days and remain in the kit for the duration of the school day.

In addition, to keep safe, your child cannot wear any jewellery during their PE session.

If your child has pierced ears, please ensure they can either remove the earrings themselves, or they do not wear them on PE day.

Alternatively, please cover the earlobes/earrings with micropore tape before they come to school.

Children with long hair will also require a hair band to tie it back.



Maths homework in Year 2 is online using MyMaths. Your child will bring home a letter that explains how to log on, their own username and a personal password.

Mymaths homework will link to learning in school that has already taken place so that your child can show you how well they are doing and by going over aspects of learning in a different way, they will consolidate and embed the concepts.

We want our children to become masters of the skills and knowledge we are teaching them and be able to apply their knowledge to help them solve puzzles and problems.

From time to time, we may also use Purple Mash to support Maths learning – we will notify you of this.



We will send home spelling words and activities for the children to practice the spelling rules and spelling words required in Year 2 following our direct teaching. This will begin week 2. We will be continuing the Little Wandle phonics program and words will be inline with the sounds we are teaching.

We will begin Year 2 revising the sounds that have been learned in Year 1 to ensure they have 'stuck' and that the children are applying their knowledge in their writing and when finding unfamiliar words in their reading.

In addition, we will be making sure that we know all of Year 1 common exception words and move on to Year 2 tricky words and will be teaching them in a structured way. We will be detectives, finding out why they are tricky!

We will inform you of the word groups as we teach them so that you can support learning these words at home.

The common exception words are on our Year 2 page as a reference for you.

Thank you for your patience and understanding when we dismiss the children at the end of the day. Our priority is the safety of the children, and we take great care in ensuring that children leave with their designated adult.

We insist that children do not leave the class line until we have seen their adult. We dismiss the children one at a time and although this makes the process a little slower at the beginning of the year, it ensures that all children are handed over safely. As we don't know you very well, please wave at us from a safe distance as your child reaches the front of the line.

Please make sure that you contact the office or a member of staff at the Year 2 gates if your child is going home with a new adult/with a friend.

We will not let a child go home with other parents unless you have told us in the morning or have contacted the office during the day.

Please **do not** use the Year 2 email for urgent messages we do not access during teaching times.
