Welcome to our final term in Year 3. We have many exciting learning opportunities to share together in our final weeks together! Fingers crossed for lots of warm, sunny weather ☺

Year 3 Curriculum

In English, this half term, we will be writing our own explanatory texts. The children will have the opportunity to 'invent' a product or machine of their choice and write a text explaining how it works. We will enjoy researching this with the help of Wallace and Gromit!

In Maths, we will be gathering our own data and applying this to bar charts and pictograms. We will also be learning about different 2D and 3D shapes and angles.

In Science, our focus will be on scientific investigations. This will provide the children with lots of fun learning experiences to develop our investigation skills, while using our scientific knowledge and understanding.

In Geography, we will be learning about Europe! We will investigate the different countries which make up the continent of Europe and their capital cities.

Our Art, this term, will focus on the artist Frida Kahlo. We will be learning about how art can express feelings and working with collage to create a background.

In Music, we will continue to develop our recorder skills. We are looking forward to practicing and perfecting pieces that contain all the notes we have been learning and practicing over the year. We look forward to sharing our music in our Year 3 showcase.

In Computing, this half term, we will be using Google Slides to present data.

In French, we will be learning how to say the 4 seasons in French and recapping our French phonics sounds.

In PSHE, children will learn about how babies grow and what babies need to live: recognising that we are all unique and special. Children will learn about their bodies growing and changing as they become an adult and understand this is when their body can make a baby. This revisits vocabulary of body parts learnt in Year 1 and 2 and is part of our science curriculum. Year 3 will then learn to name internal body parts such as sperm, ovaries, womb/uterus, egg. We will discuss gender and challenge ideas that girls wear pink and boys blue – for example. Our final session is thinking about how successful our time has been in Year 3 and considering the changes that might come as we move into Year 4.
