## Year 3 Curriculum

- In **English** this half term, we will be basing our key learning around a popular story written by Roald Dahl 'Fantastic Mr. Fox'. We will study a range of different text types including 'newspaper reports', as well as composing our own 'wanted' poster for Mr. Fox.
- Our Maths topics this half term will continue working on addition and subtraction. We will then
  move onto Multiplication and Division. It's important that children are able to use the column
  method to add, subtract and multiply. Then use the bus stop method to divide.
- In Science, our focus will be on the topic of 'Light and Shadow'. Children will learn where light comes from, how shadows are formed and investigate how shadows change. If the children have any information or books about 'Light and Shadow', they are more than welcome to bring them in to share. We encourage the children to make use of the school library. Local libraries have a wonderful selection of books, which may help with home learning, or homework activities.
- In Geography, we will be learning about the United Kingdom. We delve into the countries that make up the UK, alongside their capital cities. Due to the UK being an island, we investigate the different seas that surround us. Our final part of our learning journey, encourages the children to research into their home county 'Buckinghamshire'.
- In Art this term, we will be focusing on a particular artist all will be revealed after the first lesson! We will then recreate our own piece of work in the style of this artist.
- In **Music**, the children will continue to develop their recorder skills. We will be recapping notes B and A, as well as introducing the note G towards the end of term.
- In **Computing** this half term, children will begin an introduction to Coding. This will allow children the opportunity to code, test and debug as well as use timers.
- In RE, we will be continuing with our Hinduism topic and looking at Diwali in particular.
- We will begin our French lessons at the start of term, we will
  continue recapping learning how to say colours, number and greetings
  in French with increasing confidence.

We had such a wonderful Roman Day at school last half term! The children got to take part in lots of fun activities and even got to meet the author of Escape From Pompeii- Christina Balit.














#### Year 3 Book Recommendations
