Curriculum Overview

Rowling, Blackman, Horowitz

This half term in **English**, all our writing will be based around our Science topic of 'Space'. Over the course of the half term, the children will write: a non-chronological report about planets, a diary entry landing on a planet they have designed and finally a biography on Katherine Johnson. We can't wait to get stuck into our writing.



We will continue to build on our Place Value skills in **Maths** this term, reading, writing, ordering, rounding and comparing numbers to 1,000,000. Following this, we will move onto addition and subtraction and multiplication and division, where we will focus on written methods and reasoning.

Our **Science** topic this term is 'Space and Earth'. During this topic, lots of learning will be taking place including: Spherical Bodies, The Planets, Day and Night, The Phases of the Moon, Seasons and finally we will research an influential Scientist and understand how their theories contributed to Science today.

During **History** this term, we will be learning about The Shang Dynasty. We are really excited to be learning about this period of History as we are the first year group to be doing so. Our learning will involve looking at where The Shang Dynasty fits in our historic timeline, Gods and Kings, Dragon Boats and artefacts during this era. If you have any artefacts on this topic that you would like to share with the class, please speak to your class teacher about this.



We will be learning about sacred spaces in **RE** this term, looking at both a church and also a Sikh Temple.

In **PSHE**, children will be following the Jigsaw unit 'Me in My World'. In this unit, children think about their year ahead, understand rights and responsibilities as a citizen in their country and their school, as well as rewards and consequences about their own behaviour.



Finally, in **DT**, we will be designing, building and evaluating our own motorised vehicle. Look out for these on open evening!

Miss Raval recommends:

This fantastic picture book written by award- winning creator, Kate Pankhurst, of Fantastically Great Women is a wonderful book to fit with this term's learning of 'Space'. It follows a young girl, Luna Scope, who inspires to be an astronaut. So how does Luna go from a cardboard rocket in her room

to running experiments for the International Space Station (ISS)? Meeting incredible female space pioneers along the way, Granny takes Luna on a fact-filled space adventure showing her that anyone can be an astronaut if they dream big enough. Follow Luna's fun-filled space journey to discover new and excting facts about Space and how is young girl achieved her dream.

Miss Cook recommends: My book recommendation is 'Oranges in No Man's Land' by Elizabeth Laird. This book follows the journey of a young girl who takes a dangerous risk to save her grandmother. I absolutely loved reading this book, I couldn't put it down!





Mr Briscoe recommends: My book recommendation is 'Mouse Heart' by Fleur Hitchcock. This is a story for those who love a mystery paired with a thrilling adventure. A young girl, Mouse, is part of a theatre company when her friend Walter is wrongly arrested for murder. She makes it her mission to prove him innocent which takes her on a journey through the perilous streets of Victorian London. It had me on the edge of my seat throughout its entirety!

Mrs Dobson recommends: Over the summer break I read a smashing book called 'Time Riders'. It is about a trio of children who are able to travel backwards and forwards through time. It absolutely gripped me! It came recommended from a bookshop owner as a book that boys who read confidently would especially love - I think girls and boys would equally love this book.
