### **School Uniform**

#### Children's use of WhatsApp - Please check the content



It has come to our attention that some of the children are using WhatsApp groups where there has been some unsuitable content or misuse of this platform by some participant of these groups.

Obviously, these groups are set up outside of school and, technically, are not part of the school remit to monitor. However, on occasions, we are made aware of some of the content of these groups - particularly

when there are some unpleasant comments made or unsuitable content that has been added to these groups. In school, we wish to do as much as we can to support our children to demonstrate the appropriate conduct when using online platforms.

It has been reported to us that the majority of the content of the WhatsApp groups is perfectly appropriate, and supports the healthy, positive relationships that we see between the children in school. However, there have been instances of young people not making the best choices online or having access to see very unsuitable content via this platform.

Please can I ask all our parents to support our children who are using platforms such as this, by regularly checking the content of these groups, and to talk to children about their online conduct – and the consequences of them when they do not make the appropriate online choices or have access to unsuitable content.


We regularly revisit this topic in school, reminding children of the SMART rules and the importance of appropriate online behaviours.

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It is also useful to point out that from April 2018, the minimum age for use of WhatsApp is 16 years old.
