Lost Property

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School Uniform

May I politely remind everyone that we have a very clear school uniform policy that parents agree to adhere to with their children when choosing to send children to Priory Rise. Children should wear black **shoes** for school – and not trainers! Some of our older children like to change into their trainers for break and lunchtimes, which we are very happy to support, however, these must not be worn in school for the rest of the curriculum.

Request for Parents to Support the Office Team



Please can we urge families to support children to come into school at the beginning of the school day fully prepared for their day in school. This includes:

- arriving on time for the school day
- arriving at school with all the equipment that is required

for their school day – including lunches, water bottles, uniform items and coats etc.

Every time a parent arrives at the school office with something that has to be given to a child during the course of the school day, this interrupts to smooth operation of the school – and interrupts the learning of the children in class. One teacher reported that in one afternoon last week they had 5 interruptions from the school office for various items or messages to be delivered to children in the class.

In addition, we have also noticed a significant increase in families calling into the school office, after lunchtime to share with the office team a change to pick up arrangements for children. Again, this causes a disruption in children's learning and adds hugely to the work of the office team, who may have to seek out where that child is currently located in school to pass on this information as they may mot be in their classroom at that part of the day.

Obviously, should there be an emergency, the office team are here to support, however, in everyday arrangements, such as a forgotten water bottle or a change of pick-up arrangements, we really welcome the support from our families to make these arrangements before the children come into school and without having to interrupt the vital work of the school office team.

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Parking and Driving Safely Around the School Site



I am pleased to report that it has been a while since I have had the need to mention this issue and it is one that I hope not to have to ever refer to – and is about driving and parking around the school site at drop-off and pick-up times. However, it has come to my attention that there have been a few instances of adults, either picking up or dropping off children at school, who

have not been demonstrating the greatest of road safety or courtesy in their driving or parking around the school site at these times. Indeed, one report stated that a driver was seen to be deliberately driving towards another adult, whilst shouting and gesticulating.

In school we teach our children about values and appropriate conduct that we hope to see in everyone in our school community. Please can families support us in modelling our school values in and around the school site. Many thanks for your support.
