#### **Music Mark Success**




We are delighted to inform everyone that Priory Rise has recently been awarded the Music Mark accreditation for the significant music work that takes place across the whole school.

# Safeguarding Snippet - Keeping Safe around the School Site



Please can we ask all our families to be mindful when dropping your children off and collecting them in the vicinity of our lovely school. To support us all keeping everyone safe, we ask our families to:

Park in designated areas and avoid blocking driveways, double parking, or impeding traffic flow around school.

Plan your journey and arrive on time for drop-off and collection.

Avoid rushing or unsafe driving. We understand mornings can be hectic, but patience is key when keeping everyone safe.

Everyone is trying to get somewhere, at the same time, on time. We can help contribute to calmer journeys with some consideration and care.





### Reminders to Parents from the Business Support Team

Many thanks to many of our parents in the Priory Rise School Community for keeping us informed and up to date. We really welcome your support with this.

In addition, here are some gentle reminders of some of the important housekeeping aspects of school life:

 Please collect your child/ren from the designated gates on time. We seem to be having an increasing number of children in the school reception at the end of the school day. For the safeguarding of these children, if children are regularly late, we will send them to our Night Owls after school provision, at a cost of £8.75 per session.



- Unless an emergency You MUST call the school office
  before lunch for a change to children's pick-up arrangements.
- Please accompany your child/ren to reception when they are late to school in the morning to sign them into the building, children are too young to sign themselves in.
- Please try to make GP/dental appointments outside of school time where possible.
- Please provide at least 2 weeks' notice when submitting a leave of absence in term time request, and bear in mind leave this will only be granted in exceptional circumstances and with physical evidence attached.
- If your child has sickness and/or diarrhoea they must stay at home for 48 hours.
- It is important to book lunches on Arbor and ensure the account is regularly topped up.
- If using any of our extended services, please keep the Arbor account in a positive balance to avoid us contacting you to chase.

Thank you so much to all our families for supporting us in following these guidelines. This really supports the smooth and efficient running of the school.
